### Thoughts from the Pastor's Desk ...

Dear friends of Blessed Trinity,

Jesus asks those who would be His disciples:

"Who do people say that I am? ...

Who do *you* say that I am?"

As we join the disciples in encountering Christ in today's Gospel, we come face to face with the question of faith and our personal response to it. While at first the Lord allows us the easy answer, to be amidst the crowd, and let our voice be only one among many ("Some say ..."), He then strikes us at the heart, one-on-one ... 





### PASTORAL COUNCIL FORMATION.

Thank you to all who have come forward to be a part of our newly formed Blessed Trinity Parish pastoral commissions this past year. Many ideas for these commissions and ministries were created from our initial Open Parish Meeting discussions last Fall to see what was working and what was needed to fill a void in our community. Next, we extended an invitation to all parishioners to come to the various newly-formed commission meetings to see who was interested in learning more and sharing ideas specific to that ministry. So many of you came forward to join these meetings and have contributed suggestions and followed through with actions. Based on those meetings we currently have expanded or created the following commissions:



1-Year Later-Follow Up Open Parish Meetings. In September we will be hosting several more Open Parish Meetings as a follow up to see how we are doing one year later. (See above.)

Next Step-Selecting Council Members. Our next step is to select Council Members from parishioner recommendations to form an advisory body known as the Pastoral Council. This Council advises the Pastor in his pastoral duty and is comprised of the 6 Commission Chairs, 6 At-Large Members, Ex-Officio staff (such as Deacons, Director of Religious Education, etc.) and 1 Youth Representative (H.S. Student). This body will come together to recommend and engage pastoral initiatives throughout Greenfield and coordinate the various Commissions. Its mission is to promote, deliberate, communicate, and advise on various aspects of parish life while encouraging the activity of our parish, its vitality, outreach, and discipleship in Christ. It is a way for each commission to understand and know what the other commissions are doing for a coordinated and cohesive effort for the Parish and report back to their members for streamlined communication.

Effective Pastoral Council Members. To be an effective councilor, members must share an understanding of and commitment to the mission. Canon law stipulates that pastoral council members should be Christians in full communion with the Catholic Church, and that they be outstanding in faith, morals, and prudence. A good mix of members will bring a range of personal and professional competencies that expand and enrich the knowledge and wisdom base of the council. Pastoral councils cannot function without people who are doers, willing to take responsibility and bring research, discussion, and pondering to a conclusion. The Church particularly prizes pastoral council members who have the ability to study a matter deeply, reflect on it thoroughly, and draw sound conclusions to be effective in fulfilling the council's mission.
