### Thoughts from the Pastor's Desk ...

Dear friends of Blessed Trinity,

The Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord, which Holy Mother Church celebrates each year on August 6<sup>th</sup>, this year falls on a Sunday. As a Feast of the Lord, it takes liturgical precedence over the Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The liturgy therefore invites us to join Ss. Peter, James, and John as the Lord Himself invited them up the mountain and revealed to them His transfigured glory.

What the privileged witnesses were able to see, then were charged to tell no one until the Son of Man had been raised from the dead, has now been handed on to us, sharers in the same grace and privilege. Through the ministry of those first three, and the countless generations since who have proclaimed the truth of Christ and His Church, you and I can now revel in the same wonder. "His face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, conversing with him".



As Jesus Himself proclaims the truths of the Kingdom using parables, that which is hidden becomes visible, that which is obscured (but ever present!) is fully revealed. In a sense, the truths of God and His majesty are right there before us in life but we barely recognize them!

It is the work of the Church, the People of God gathered together in prayer and virtue, to make Christ known and reflect the light of His grace in our darkened world. It must be our mission to boldly proclaim Christ crucified, Christ risen. We strive to heed the words of St. Peter: "We possess the prophetic message that is altogether reliable. You will do well to be attentive to it, as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts".

Next Sunday, August 13<sup>th</sup>, I earnestly invite you to gather and celebrate who we are as the people of Greenfield and the family that is the Church. Join me at our 11:00 AM Mass, followed by cookout and socializing between 12:00 and 2:00. I am especially excited to announce that some 20 novices and postulants with the Servidora Sisters will be with us that day as we celebrate our parish anniversary and acclaim St. Mary with our deanery event (which begins at 2:00 with confessions available already at 12:45).

These young women, discerning Christ's call in their life, are a joyful reflection of His light in the world. May they be an encouragement for each of us, especially the girls and young women of our parish who are likewise discovering God's invitation pressing upon their hearts, whether it be as consecrated sisters and religious, as wives and mothers, or as faithful daughters and single persons.

# OUR FAITH.

### A PRACTICAL GUIDE TO CONFESSION

**PREPARING FOR CONFESSION** • Pray for the Holy Spirit to help enlighten your conscience so you may know your sins, be sorry for them, and tell them honestly and sincerely. • With the Holy Spirit's help, identify your sins (what sins and how often). • Pray for courage to make a good confession and prepare to receive the great gift of forgiveness. Remember, Jesus wants what is best for you. He is waiting to forgive you and welcome you back.

**MAKING YOUR CONFESSION.** When you arrive at confession, the priest will greet you and both of you will make the Sign of the Cross. You may begin by saying: "Forgive me Father, for I have sinned. It has been (state length of time) since my last confession. These are my sins." Then tell your sins, especially any serious sins. The priest will give the necessary advice and assign penance. Then, you pray the Act of Contrition (see below). It is okay to take the prayer on a piece of paper in with you. You may also say your own Act of Contrition, as long as your prayer mentions that you are sincerely sorry, and that you will try not to commit these sins again. Then the priest will give you absolution (forgiveness). Do your penance as soon as possible.

**ACT OF CONTRITION.** O my God, I am heartily sorry for having off ended You, and I detest all of my sins, because I dread the loss of heaven and the pains of hell, but most of all because they off end You, my God, who are all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly intend, with the help of Your grace, to sin no more and to avoid the near occasion of sin. Amen.

**EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE.** The examination of conscience generally takes place before going to individual confession but can be used at any time to review one's past. The purpose is to call to mind our sins in an orderly fashion (using the Ten Commandments), to best prepare to receive God's forgiveness.

- **1. I AM THE LORD YOUR GOD. YOU SHALL NOT HAVE STRANGE GODS BEFORE ME.** Do I pray daily, and seek to place God as the highest priority in my life? Do I seek to surrender myself to God's Word, as taught by the guidance of the Church? Have I been involved with superstitious practices or witchcraft (Ouija board, tarot cards, fortune telling, horoscopes), which falsely attribute power to anyone or anything else than God? Have I received communion knowingly while in a state of mortal sin, without making an effort to go to confession? Have I ever purposely withheld a sin from the priest in confession?
- **2. YOU SHALL NOT TAKE THE NAME OF THE LORD YOUR GOD IN VAIN.** Have I used God's name carelessly? Have I sworn or used foul language? Have I told jokes which ridicule God, Mary, or the Saints? Have I ever wished for evil upon someone?
- **3. REMEMBER TO KEEP HOLY THE SABBATH.** Have I deliberately missed Mass on Sundays or on other Holy Days of Obligation? Do I pay attention and participate at Mass, or am I passive and uninvolved? Have I tried to keep Sunday as a day of rest and a time for family? Do I do needless work on Sunday?
- **4. HONOR YOUR FATHER AND MOTHER.** Do I do my best to honor and obey my parents, and those in authority in my life? Have I ever insulted my father or mother, swearing at them, or talking poorly about them to others? When I have wronged my parents, do I apologize and admit my failings? Have I used tobacco, or drank alcohol against the wishes of my parents?
- **5. YOU SHALL NOT KILL.** Have I had an abortion or encouraged anyone to do so? Have I abused alcohol or other drugs? Have I driven recklessly, possibly putting myself or others at risk? Have I harbored feelings of hatred or envy towards others, been resentful or jealous? Have I been in any fights (physical or verbal?)
- **6. YOU SHALL NOT COMMIT ADULTERY.** Have I respected members of the opposite sex, or have I treated them as objects? Do I sincerely seek to be chaste (pure) in my thoughts, words, and actions? Have I engaged in impure acts by myself (romantic fantasy or masturbation)? Have I engaged in sexual touching with another person or had sexual intercourse?
- **7. YOU SHALL NOT STEAL.** Have I stolen anything from a store or another person which is not rightfully mine? Do I cheat in school, either by copying homework or stealing answers on a test? Do I waste time at school or at work, thereby cheating myself or my employer?
- **8. YOU SHALL NOT BEAR FALSE WITNESS AGAINST YOUR NEIGHBOR.** Have I lied or deliberately withheld the entire truth to protect myself? Have I exaggerated any claims to make myself look better, or to impress my friends? Have I gossiped, telling things about someone to harm their good name? Do I keep confidential what was told to me in secret, or do I break my word?
- **9. YOU SHALL NOT COVET (DESIRE) YOUR NEIGHBOR'S WIFE.** Have I consented to impure thoughts, not trying to control my imagination? Have I looked at pornographic videos, magazines, computer images or stories? Have I told impure jokes or stories that would offend God or the dignity of others?
- **10. YOU SHALL NOT COVET (DESIRE) YOUR NEIGHBOR'S GOODS.** Am I jealous of other people's gifts, talents, or possessions? Am I greedy or selfish? Am I materialistic? Do I think about the poor? Do I make an effort to reach out to help them? (source: net ministries)



### PASTORAL COUNCIL FORMATION.

Thank you to all who have come forward to be a part of our newly formed Blessed Trinity Parish pastoral commissions this past year. Many ideas for these commissions and ministries were created from our initial Open Parish Meeting discussions last Fall to see what was working and what was needed to fill a void in our community. Next, we extended an invitation to all parishioners to come to the various newly-formed commission meetings to see who was interested in learning more and sharing ideas specific to that ministry. So many of you came forward to join these meetings and have contributed suggestions and followed through with actions. Based on those meetings we currently have expanded or created the following commissions:



**1-Year Later-Follow Up Open Parish Meetings.** In September we will be hosting several more Open Parish Meetings as a follow up to see how we are doing one year later. (See above.)

Next Step-Selecting Council Members. Our next step is to select Council Members from parishioner recommendations to form an advisory body known as the Pastoral Council. This Council advises the Pastor in his pastoral duty and is comprised of the 6 Commission Chairs, 6 At-Large Members, Ex-Officio staff (such as Deacons, Director of Religious Education, etc.) and 1 Youth Representative (H.S. Student). This body will come together to recommend and engage pastoral initiatives throughout Greenfield and coordinate the various Commissions. Its mission is to promote, deliberate, communicate, and advise on various aspects of parish life while encouraging the activity of our parish, its vitality, outreach, and discipleship in Christ. It is a way for each commission to understand and know what the other commissions are doing for a coordinated and cohesive effort for the Parish and report back to their members for streamlined communication.

Effective Pastoral Council Members. To be an effective councilor, members must share an understanding of and commitment to the mission. Canon law stipulates that pastoral council members should be Christians in full communion with the Catholic Church, and that they be outstanding in faith, morals, and prudence. A good mix of members will bring a range of personal and professional competencies that expand and enrich the knowledge and wisdom base of the council. Pastoral councils cannot function without people who are doers, willing to take responsibility and bring research, discussion, and pondering to a conclusion. The Church particularly prizes pastoral council members who have the ability to study a matter deeply, reflect on it thoroughly, and draw sound conclusions to be effective in fulfilling the council's mission. If you or someone you know might be a good fit for this Council, to serve on a three year term, please call or email Father Pierz or the Parish Office with your recommendations to this Council. The main role of a Pastoral Council member is to advise the Pastor and represent the views of all parishioners within the Parish and to listen to, and understand, the views and needs of different groups in the wider Greenfield community.

Once fully seated, the Pastoral Council will meet monthly and our first encounter is planned for October!


