#### Thoughts from the Pastor's Desk ...

Dear friends of Blessed Trinity,

Today we enter the last week of Lent before Holy Week. Each week we have encountered persons interacting with Christ. The Apostles on Mount Tabor. The woman at the well. The man born blind. The friend dead and buried. Personal encounters with Jesus, the Word made flesh.

Each week we are coming closer to who Jesus is and who we are in Him. Divine Revelation in the Paschal mystery. Through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving we have allowed ourselves to decrease so He may increase. Even more, we have allowed ourselves to begin to recognize what we think human life is all about ... and what it's not.

We've thought the wells of human ingenuity would satiate our thirst. We've thought reality is as it merely appears to be. We've thought death is the final farewell and has the last word.

Our thirst. Our blindness. Our death.

Even death and its stench is no cause for fear. Lazarus suffers the death that awaits all material creation. Yet Jesus had said "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it". So what's up?!

Earthly death with its grip is only scary if all we have and all we live for is earthliness. If all we seek are the vainglories of physical life, we are left thirsting. If all we see are the fleeting images of worldliness our weak senses can perceive, we are blind to reality. If all we live for dies, we die with it. Yet God who is endures.

Men and women of faith are men and women who live in a profound relationship with God who IS. We are people who are fed not on symbols and senselessness, but on the very substance of life in God. Pure Spirit. Supreme Being. Word made flesh. The Risen Lord! Jesus saves us from the eternal death that is separation from God. That is the greater death to fear! The death of sin. The death of separation.

So much that we've become convinced of, addicted to, and enslaved by in our human existence, we are invited to be set free from in our personal encounter with Christ Jesus. Through faith and reason, we are coming to understand the Truth. Through the Word made flesh, we are coming to believe in Him who is! Jesus Christ invites us to be authentically and faithfully united in Him.

"I am the resurrection and the life!" Jesus declares.

We have engaged a program of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, and over its course have been invited to a more profound realization of our Christian life and faith. To come to life! To come to Christ!

Most Holy Trinity, I adore You! My God, I love you in the Most Blessed Sacrament!

**TODAY IS THE FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT.** Or Passion Sunday which used to mark the beginning of Passiontide. However, in 1969, the Roman Catholic Church removed Passiontide from the liturgical year of the Novus Ordo.

The readings today are about how God can take us from death to new life. Below are some reflections to ponder.

- **New life and resurrection**: God's power to bring life out of death and hope out of despair, as demonstrated in the raising of Lazarus from the dead.
- Faith: The importance of faith in Jesus Christ, as exemplified by Martha's confession that Jesus is the Messiah and the Son of God.
- Repentance: The call to repentance and conversion, as expressed in Paul's letter to the Romans, and the need to live according to the Spirit and not the flesh.
- Trust in God's mercy: The promise of God's mercy and forgiveness, as expressed in the Responsorial Psalm, and the need to trust in God's loving kindness and plenteous redemption.
- The Pascal Mystery: Through the raising of Lazarus from the dead, Jesus demonstrates his power over death and foreshadows his own resurrection. This event is a sign of hope for believers, as it points to the victory of life over death.
- **Grief and suffering**: The gospel illustrates the reality of human suffering and the pain that comes with loss, as well as the compassion and empathy that Jesus shows towards those who are grieving. **Young-Catholics.com**

#### LENTEN SEASON: STATIONS OF THE CROSS.

The Stations of the Cross are representations of the path Jesus bore on his way to the crucifixion. They involve Jesus enduring suffering, insults, moments of support, and the intense sacrifice that Christians believe Jesus undertook for human salvation. The object of the Stations is to help the faithful make a pilgrimage (in spirit) to the chief scenes of Christ's sufferings and death. Most simply, they are usually performed during Lent, especially on Good Friday, and are about remembering Christ's suffering for our sake.

#### **LENTEN REGULATIONS 2023**

- 1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence from meat as well as days of fast, when only one full meal is allowed. On days of fast, two other meatless meals may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal.
- 2. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat.
- 3. The obligation to abstain from meat begins at age fourteen (14) and does not cease.
- 4. The obligation to fast begins at age eighteen (18) and ceases at age fifty-nine (59).

Please note: Although the faithful may excuse themselves from fast and abstinence, for a just cause, there is an obligation to substitute another penance in its place. No Catholic should lightly excuse him/herself from these Lenten obligations.


