Thoughts from the Pastor's Desk ...

Dear friends of Blessed Trinity,

The readings and call to action of Holy Mass this weekend speak well to our ongoing parish efforts. Gathered as the People of God, the faithful of Greenfield, we seek the voice of the Lord, discern His promptings, and find courage in divine providence. "For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them" (Mt 18:20).

Finding ourselves in this new season after Labor Day, I draw your attention to the matter of our pastoral initiatives. As you know from the bulletins of the last several weeks, our Pastoral Commissions are beginning their fall schedule of discussions, activities, and events. From our first Open Parish Meetings in December, our parish has instituted several pastoral commissions highlighting and focusing a multitude of programs and initiatives.

Our Pastoral Ministry to the Sick & Homebound (with cochairs Ava Clark and Pat Coffin) coordinates visits and sacraments for those in our nursing homes, hospitals, and among our homebound. With ongoing volunteer recruitment and training, Blessed Trinity Parish can expand the nature of our relationships and strengthen our accompaniment of those in particular infirmity or physical difficulty. Our Worship Commission discussions on a range of matters affecting our liturgies, worship, and music as it meets each First Wednesday of the month. Our Pastoral Ministry to the Homeless, Poor, and Hungry engages various programs (such as our Food Pantry and Community Meals programs) as well as local actions to serve many who struggle throughout Greenfield, our streets, and neighborhoods. Our Faith Formation Commission, which meets each Second Thursday at 6PM, is excited to commence our Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (with classes on Tuesdays at 6PM), as well as various sacramental preparation programs and possible bible studies in the near future.

With the foundation of these established Pastoral Commissions and the fruits of our conversations from this week's Open Parish Meetings (Wednesday at 10:00 AM / Thursday at 7:00 PM / Saturday at 11:00 AM), we will have the opportunity to set the course for our parish and give direction to a newly formed Pastoral Council. Consisting of the chairs of the Pastoral Commissions and several At-Large members representing the diversity of our parish, together with our deacons and pastoral staff (such as Director of Religious Education and Director of Educational Outreach), our Pastoral Council will be able

to engage the mission defined by our faith, hope, and love, that of the proclamation of the Gospel and the salvation of souls. Indeed we heed the words of the Gospel acclamation, "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation".

Please give ardent thought and prayer to your possible involvement and increased engagement in any and all of these areas of parish life, and know how valuable your time, talent, and treasure is. As collaborators together in the action of God's grace here in our midst we can be ever reminded of the words of Jesus today: "Again, amen, I say if two of you agree on about anything for which they pray, it shall be granted to them by my heavenly Father". The Lord will not be outdone in this pastoral zeal He invites us to share! Rise, let us be on our way!

The new Pastoral Council will work to identify and coordinate the many ministries and activities in our parish. Our goal is to open lines of communication between our pastor, the pastoral council, our pastoral commissions, and the various groups, we all share in coordinating activities within the parish. In the spirit of cooperation we hope to work together to build a strong, welcoming spirit within our parish that will foster even greater participation in our community.

To that end, we are looking for parishioners who would give of their time and leadership talents to help our pastor in his administration of the close to sixty ministries and activities in the parish. We encourage members of these groups to consider nomination to the council as well as those who would represent the parish-at-large.



Nominees must be 18 years old, having received the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist), registered and active in the Parish, who are outstanding in firm faith, good morals, and prudence.

A nomination form is found below. Upon filling out you can place it in the basket or turn in to the Parish Office. You may also contact the Parish Office by telephone or email with a nomination.

Nominations will remain open though September 30th.

'Let the spiritual shepherds recognize and promote the dignity as well as the responsibility of the laity in the Church. Let them willingly employ their prudent advice. Let them confidently assign duties to them in the service of the Church, allowing them freedom and room for action. Further, let them encourage lay people so that they may undertake tasks on their own initiative. Attentively in Christ, let them consider with fatherly love the projects, suggestions and desires proposed by the laity. However, let the shepherds respectfully acknowledge that just freedom which belongs to everyone in this earthly city.

A great many wonderful things are to be hoped for from this familiar dialogue between the laity and their spiritual leaders: in the laity a strengthened sense of personal responsibility; a renewed enthusiasm; a more ready application of their talents to the projects of their spiritual leaders. The latter, on the other hand, aided by the experience of the laity, can more clearly and more incisively come to decisions regarding both spiritual and temporal matters. In this way, the whole Church, strengthened by each one of its members, may more effectively fulfill its mission for the life of the world."

OUR MINISTRIES.

From Chapter V: The Pastoral Council

Can. 511. In each diocese, to the extent that pastoral circumstances recommend it, a pastoral council is to be established whose responsibility it is to investigate under the authority of the bishop all those things which pertain to pastoral works, to ponder them and to propose practical conclusions about them.

Can. 512. §1. The pastoral council consists of Christian faithful who are in full communion with the Catholic Church, clerics, members of institutes of consecrated life and especially lay persons, who are designated in a manner determined by the diocesan bishop.

§2. The Christian faithful who are appointed to the pastoral council are to be so selected that the entire portion of the people of God which constitutes the diocese is truly reflected, with due regard for the diverse regions, social conditions and professions of the diocese as well as the role which they have in the apostolate, either as individuals or in conjunction with others.

§3. No one except Christians of proven faith, good morals and outstanding prudence are to be appointed to the pastoral council.

Can. 513. §1. The pastoral council is to be established for a period of time according to the prescriptions of the statutes which are issued by the bishop.

§2. When the see is vacant the pastoral council ceases to exist.

Can. 514. §1. It pertains exclusively to the diocesan bishop to convoke the pastoral council according to the necessities of the apostolate and to preside over it; the pastoral council enjoys only a consultative vote; it is for the bishop alone to make public what has been done in the council.

§2. The pastoral council is to be convoked at least once a year.

Can. 536 §1. If the diocesan bishop judges it opportune after he has heard the presbyteral council, a pastoral council is to be established in each parish, over which the pastor presides and in which the Christian faithful, together with those who share in pastoral care by virtue of their office in the parish, assist in fostering pastoral activity.

§2. A pastoral council possesses a consultative vote only and is governed by the norms established by the diocesan bishop.

PARISH AED INSTALLATION



Our parish will be installing AEDs in our facilities in the coming weeks.

"An AED, or automated external defibrillator, is used to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. It's a sophisticated, yet easy-to-

use, medical device that can analyze the heart's rhythm and, if necessary, deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm" (Cf. Red Cross).

Thanks to the generosity of the Knights of Columbus, they have covered the expense of two out of three devices, at a cost of \$1750 each.




